

**Greed is repeatedly condemned throughout Scripture as destructive, idolatrous, and opposed to God's will.** The Bible warns that greed leads to ruin, discontent, and separation from God, while urging believers to pursue contentment, generosity, and righteousness instead.

## Key Bible Passages on Greed


- **Luke 12:15** – *“Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions.”*
- **1 Timothy 6:9–10** – Greed leads people into temptation and ruin: *“For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil.”*
- **Colossians 3:5** – Greed is equated with idolatry: *“Put to death... greed, which is idolatry.”*
- **Hebrews 13:5** – *“Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have.”*
- **Proverbs 15:27** – *“The greedy bring ruin to their households, but the one who hates bribes will live.”*
- **Ecclesiastes 5:10** – *“Whoever loves money never has enough; whoever loves wealth is never satisfied with their income.”*
- **Ezekiel 22:12** – Condemns Israel for extortion and greed, showing how it corrupts society.
- **1 John 2:16** – Warns against *“the lust of the eyes”*—a form of greed that comes from the world, not the Father.

## Why Greed is Evil in Scripture

- **Destroys contentment** – Greed blinds people to God's provision and keeps them restless.
- **Leads to idolatry** – Scripture equates greed with worshiping wealth instead of God.
- **Corrupts relationships** – Greed causes exploitation, injustice, and broken trust.
- **Opens the door to other sins** – Covetousness often leads to lying, stealing, and oppression.

## Biblical Alternative to Greed

- **Contentment** – Trusting God's provision (Philippians 4:11–13).
- **Generosity** – Sharing blessings with others (2 Corinthians 9:6–7).
- **Stewardship** – Using resources wisely for God's kingdom (Matthew 25:14–30).

 **In short:** The Word of God documents the evil of greed in both Old and New Testaments, portraying it as idolatry, a root of evil, and a destroyer of households. Instead, believers are called to live with gratitude, generosity, and trust in God's provision.
